Supervisor's Message

Dear Neighbor:

Tomorrow marks 20 years since the attack on the World Trade Center on 9/11. As Americans we all United and we continue to do to this day to remember the pain and sacrifice and to recognize the heroes who live and died saving others. I wish that same spirit ignited to defeat Covid. I hope 20 years from now the stories shared will highlight our unity, strength and resilience.

20 years ago, I lay sleeping with my youngest baby boy Ben next to me. My husband Casey suddenly woke me exclaiming "something's happening" and rallied me to get up to join him in the living room to watch the TV.

His parents lived on 14th Street at the time. No TV or cellphones then. His dad had already left for the subway for work. We called them to check on and described the situation unfolding to his mom. We urged against, but she headed out to find Casey's dad.

We worried for hours wondering. Fortunately for our family, they were reunited safely but others suffered a worse fate. That day 8 EMTs, 60 police officers, 343 firefighters, 2997 civilians died. Hundreds more have died since from cancers acquired from breathing the dust during the rescue operation. #Neverforget

Our secretary in my law firm quit that day deciding life was too short for litigation. Our American lives changed forever in how we travel and keep our community safe from outside interests. But our country unified around the changes needed to keep our communities safe.

Saturday, Sept. 11, 2021, marks the 20th Year of Remembrance of the tragic events that took place on Sept. 11, 2001.

This Saturday, Sept. 11, 2021 many fire departments across Orange County will broadcast through Facebook Live a brief Ceremony of Remembrance and reflection, in honor of the lives lost at the World Trade Center, the Pentagon and Shanksville, Pennsylvania.

The countywide broadcast will be brief, and officially begin just after 9 a.m. and conclude at approximately 9:15 a.m. It will be heard by all fire stations throughout the County. If tuning into the livestream, please join us by 9 a.m., as again, the ceremony is brief.

The community is welcome to join us at any of the fire stations, but please be mindful if you attend to the strict health and safety protocols, masks included, and note that public access will be limited to the exterior of the fire stations only. My team will be at fire stations throughout the district.

Additionally, if in attendance, please arrive by 8:45 a.m., as the broadcast will begin just after 9 a.m. and concludes at approximately 9:15 a.m.

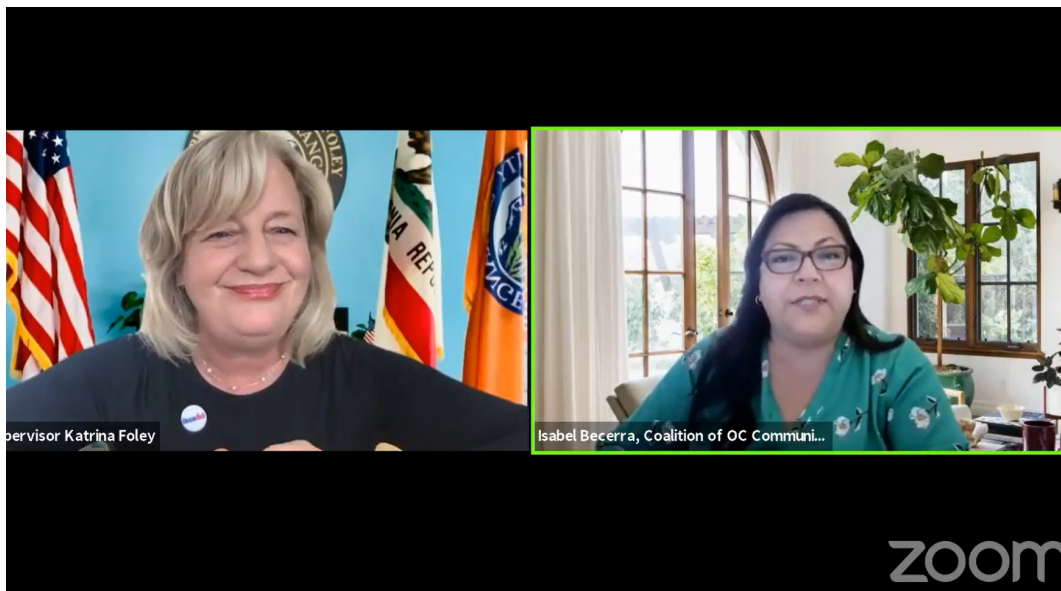
Other events are planned throughout the day in District 2: if you attend, I encourage you to wear a mask. Here are some links to events in the area.

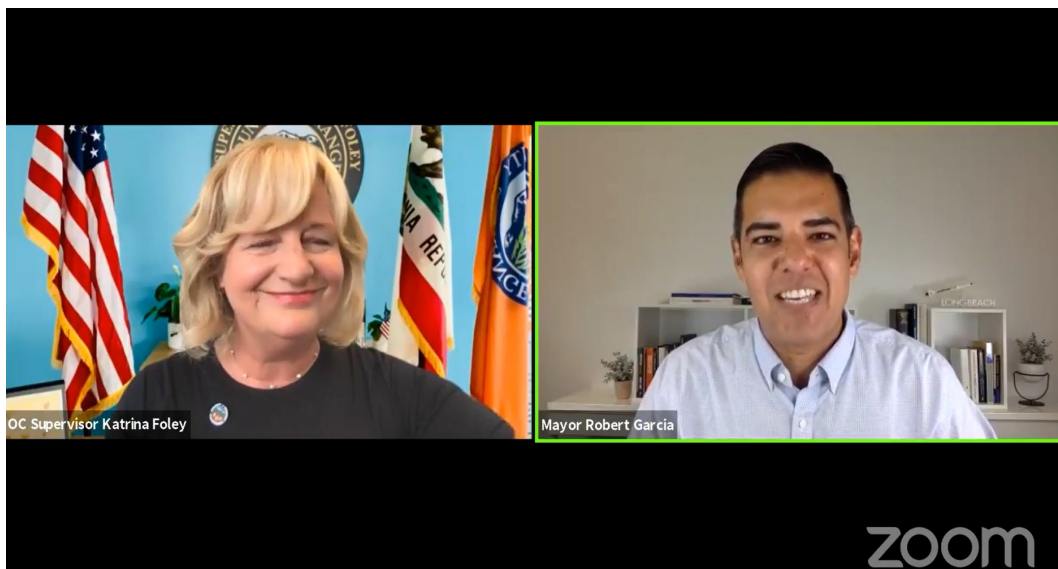

OC Health Care Agency COVID-19 Updates: Confirms Pediatric Death Due to COVID-19, Explains Risk of Mu Variant and Defines “Booster” vs. “Additional” Dose

(Santa Ana, California) – The OC Health Care Agency (HCA) has confirmed a COVID-related pediatric death in Orange County. In August, a child under the age of 5 with underlying health conditions died of complications related to COVID-19 infection.

“My heart goes out to this family who has lost a precious young life. This is an urgent reminder that we must do everything we can to protect our little ones, the children and infants in our community who are not yet eligible for a vaccination,” HCA Director and County Health Officer **Dr. Clayton Chau** said. “This means being fully vaccinated if you are over the age of 12, as well as wearing a mask indoors, avoiding crowds, maintaining physical distancing in poorly ventilated areas, and washing your hands regularly. I cannot stress enough how important these precautions are, not only to protect you, but those you care about around you.”

On August 30, 2021, the World Health Organization announced the monitoring of a new coronavirus variant called “Mu,” which was first identified in Columbia in January but has since been confirmed in at least 43 countries. There have been only 14 reported cases in Orange County, and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) has reported that the Mu Variant is currently not an immediate threat in the U.S. Variant cases in Orange County can be tracked on the COVID-19 Dashboard, which is available at occovid19.ochcahealthinfo.com/coronavirus-in-oc.

“COVID-19 will be present in Orange County for the foreseeable future, and there is always the possibility of new versions of the virus emerging, like the Delta and Mu variants,” says **Dr. Matthew Zahn**, Deputy County Health Officer. “Those facts do not change the things we can do to prevent this disease. Vaccination against COVID-19 is still the most effective way to prevent you from getting sick, being hospitalized or dying from COVID-19. In Orange County, someone who is not fully vaccinated is almost six times more likely to get COVID-19 than a person who is fully vaccinated. Even with slightly declining cases in Orange County, you should get vaccinated.”

Between September 2 and September 8, the seven-day average case rate dropped from 17.4 to 13.6 per 100,000 people, with the average number of daily COVID-19 cases declining from 563 to 438. The positivity rate also decreased from 6.2 to 5.2 percent, hospitalizations from 500 to 432 per day, and ICU admissions from 138 to 129 per day. Orange County COVID-19 case counts and testing figures are updated daily, Monday through Friday, at occcovid19.ochealthinfo.com/coronavirus-in-oc.

In addition to offering vaccines to those who are not fully vaccinated, the County of Orange mobile vaccination clinics and other current vaccination channels are now offering “additional” doses of the Pfizer and Moderna mRNA vaccines to individuals ages 12 and over with moderate to severe immune compromise conditions. **The additional dose is not the same as a “booster” shot.**

“Please do not confuse the additional dose for immunocompromised with the booster shot; we are not yet offering booster shots, as we need to wait for authorization by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) and recommendation by the CDC’s Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP),” says **Dr. Regina Chinsio-Kwong**, Deputy County Health Officer. “Until we receive instructions from the FDA and ACIP, only people who are immunocompromised are being scheduled for the additional dose at this time.”

Individuals who are immunocompromised can schedule an appointment for their additional dose of Pfizer or Moderna by visiting [Othena.com](https://occcovid19.ochealthinfo.com) or calling the OC COVID-19 Hotline at (714) 834-2000. They can self-attest that they are immunocompromised when scheduling but will need to bring proof that they completed their second dose of Pfizer or Moderna at the time of their appointment.

An additional vaccine dose is not currently recommended by the CDC for immunocompromised persons who received a single dose of the Johnson & Johnson (J&J) vaccine.

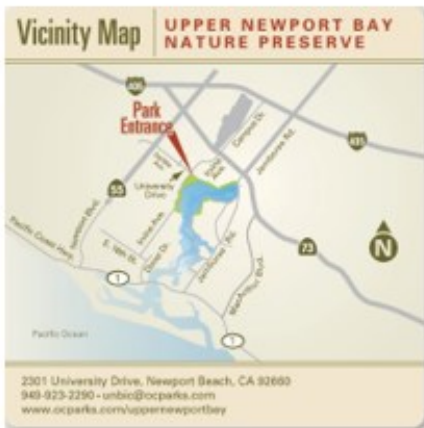

CALIFORNIA SMALL BUSINESS COVID-19 RELIEF GRANT PROGRAM



A round of new funding will open up September 9 through September 30 for California's Small Business COVID-19 Relief Grant Program. The program provides grants of **\$5,000 to \$25,000** to small businesses hurt by the pandemic. Businesses are eligible based on annual revenue as documented in their most recent tax return. Until September 8, the program is processing waitlisted applicants from previous rounds. Waitlisted applicants do not need to reapply.
