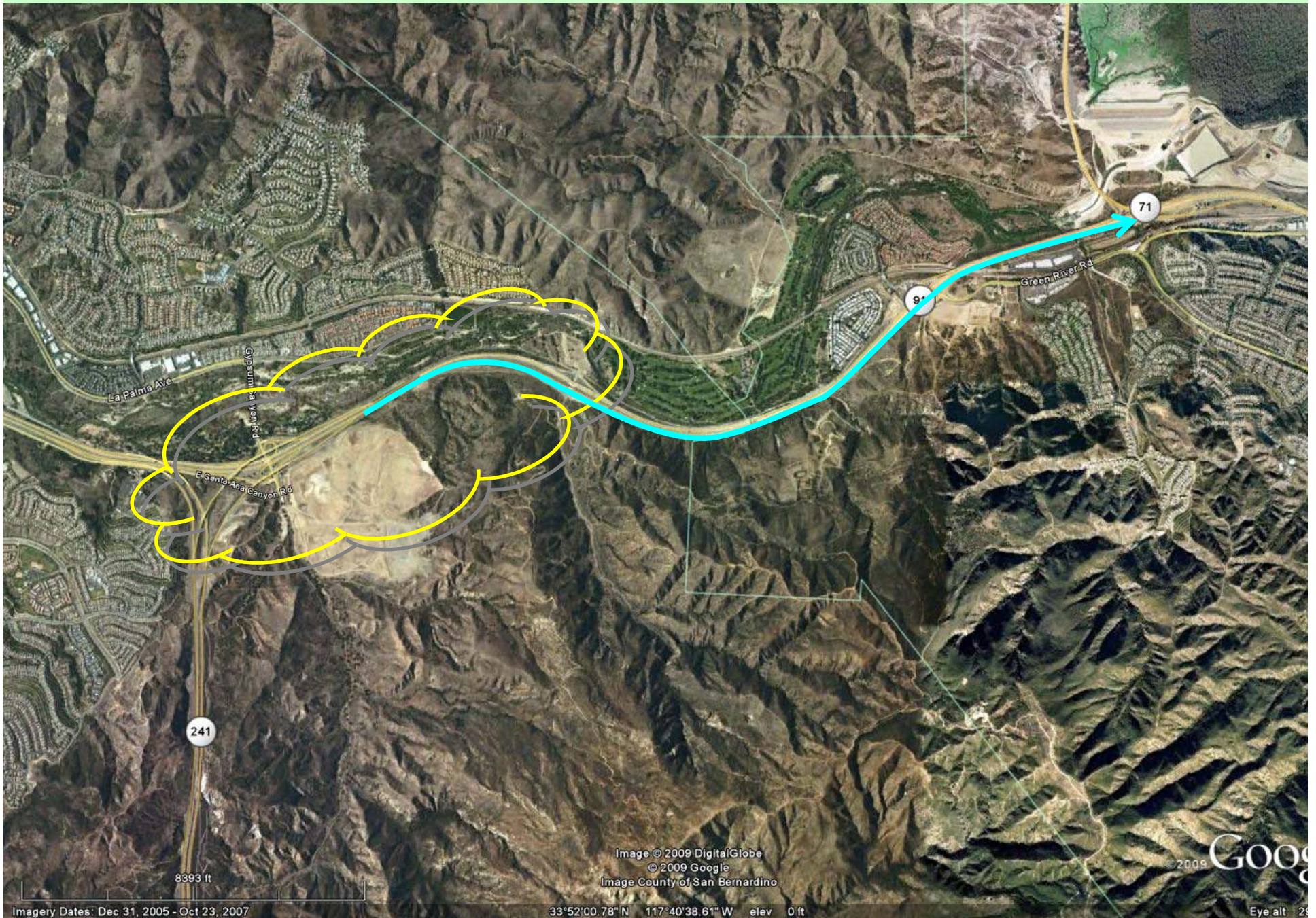

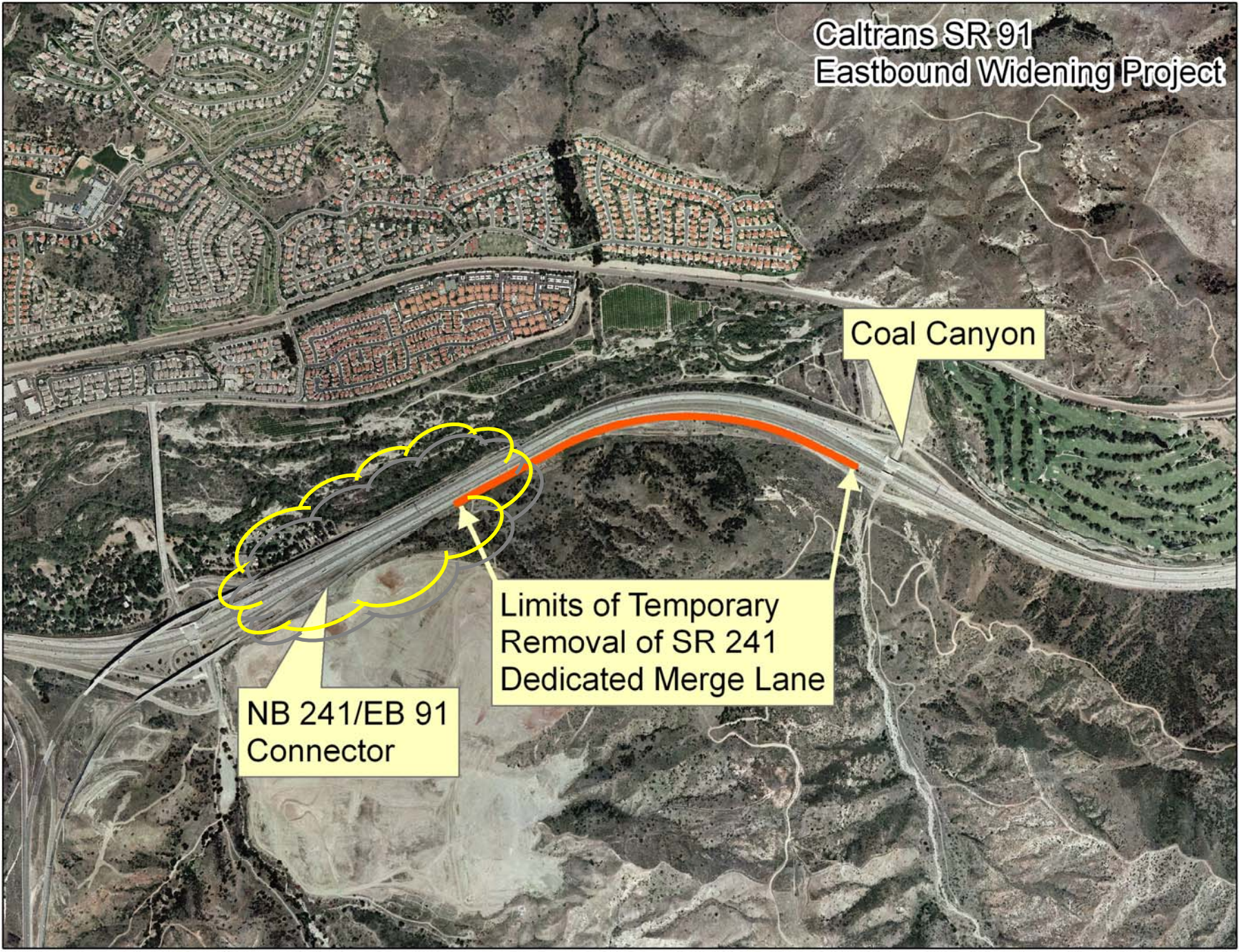

91 FREEWAY CONSTRUCTION ALERT

Caltrans and OCTA are working on a widening project on the eastbound 91 freeway, where a new lane is being added to reduce congestion. Because of the construction, the dedicated lane for the 241 Toll Road traffic to merge onto the 91 freeway has been temporarily removed.

When complete, this project will help relieve the bottlenecks at the merge of the northbound 241 Toll Road/91 freeway and at the interchange of the 91 freeway/SR 71, as well as improve the general flow of eastbound traffic on the 91 freeway in the area.

The merge lane to the 91 freeway is scheduled to re-open next April. The Toll Roads' engineers are working with Caltrans and OCTA to make sure the project stays on schedule.

A TIP TO AVOID THIS INCONVENIENCE - from the 241 Toll Road, take the 91 freeway westbound to the first exit (Weir Canyon), get off and get back on the 91 freeway heading eastbound.
