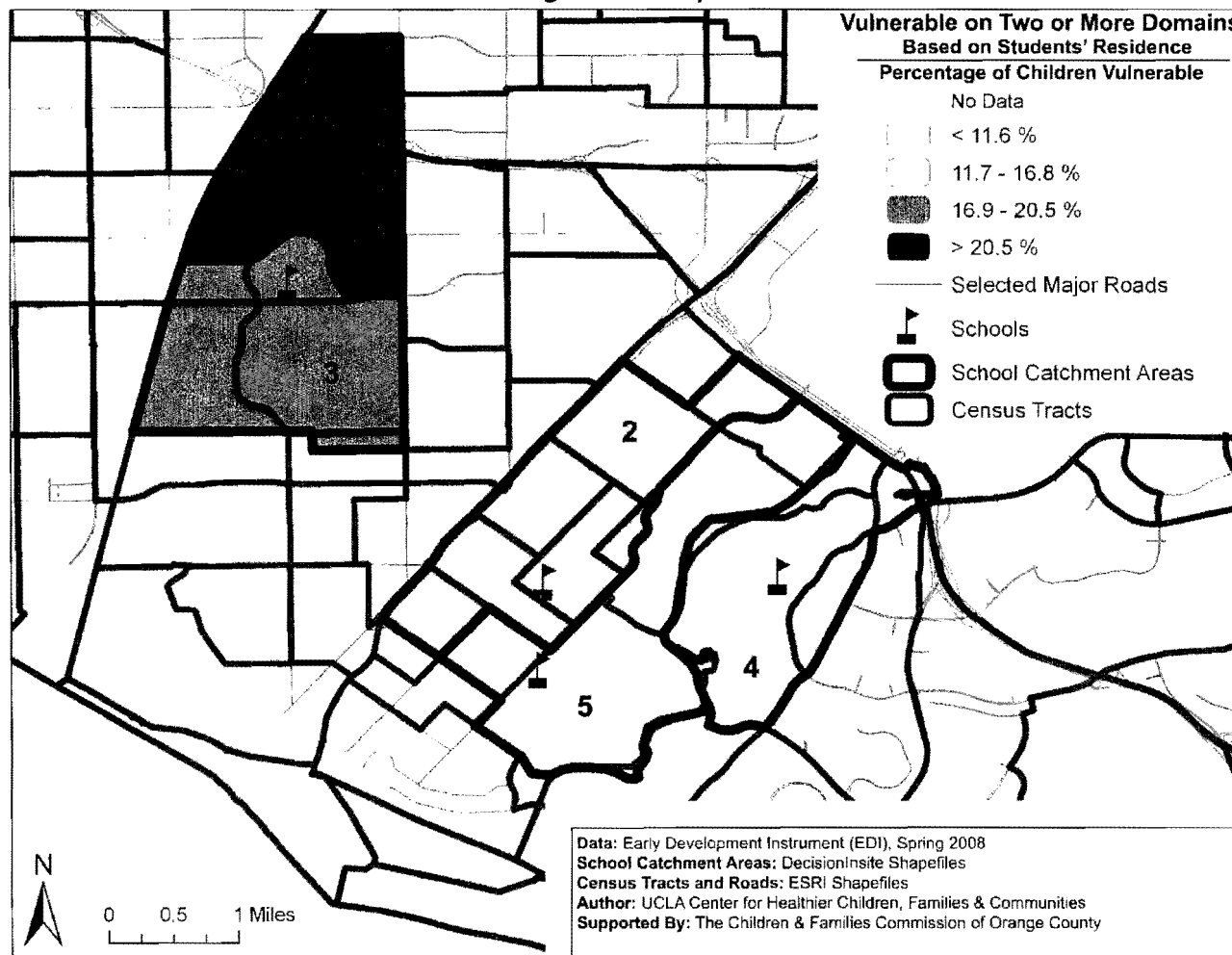

EDI DATA: PROMISING TOOL

FOR INFORMED PROFESSIONAL PRACTICE

1. Inform programs in tailoring ECE and early elementary services to specific needs of the community
2. Way to measure our progress in closing the achievement gap with a common baseline measure at kindergarten entry
3. Opportunity to identify unique strengths in communities that have been historically at-risk for school underachievement
4. Identify geographic areas with vulnerabilities within specific domains
