




State of the Project - Software Development Life Cycle Status

The Four Tiers of PTMS

- Tier 1 COB and TTC Shared Modules
- □ Tier 1A COB Assessment Appeals

Tier 3 Treasurer Tax Collector

Not Started



- Significant Progress
 - Tier 1: COB and TTC shared modules: Claims for Refund, Fee Based Data Services
- System went Live 2010
 - Tier 1A: COB Assessment Appeals
- Code delivered and County testing in final stages
 - Tier 2: A/C Modules: Allocation, Extension of Roll
- Code delivered and County testing in final stages
- The Allocation and Extension of Roll receiving good results
 - Tier 3: TTC Core Modules: Tax Bill Creation, Billing & Notices, Payment Processing and Roll Maintenance
- Code completed for core modules and Vendor is verifying quality



- Upcoming Major Milestones
 - Tier 1A: COB Assessment Appeals
- April 2012 County acceptance sign-off
 - Tier 2: A/C Apportionment module
- March 2012 County completion of Apportionment of Levies testing
- April 2012 County acceptance sign-off of all Tier 2 modules
- Tier 3: TTC core modules
- May 18, 2012 Receive coded modules from Tata Consultancy Services (TCS) and begin County testing




- **❖ Major Milestone Dates That Will Be Missed**
 - February 2012 TCS delivery of a complete and fully integrated PTMS per contract agreement
 - ► TCS coding of Tier 3 modules is behind schedule
 - Integration of all PTMS Tiers will be impacted
 - July 2012 Scheduled Go-Live
 - County cannot Go-Live July 2012 with missed Tier 3 deadlines
 - Insufficient time for County testing and implementation roll-out



- Impact of Code Delivery Delays
 - New TCS Proposal Deliver Tier 3 code in 2 drops
 - May 2012 Drop 1: Tier 3 core modules
 - Dec 2012 Drop 2: Tier 3 remaining modules plus integrated PTMS
 - PTMS Go-Live Date Revised to December 2013
 - Final County testing cannot start until January 2013 and will require 6 to 8 months to complete
 - Upon County final PTMS acceptance, roll-out to users will require an additional 2 to 4 months

Project Risks

Delivery by TCS

- Timeliness of completion
- Quality of vendor testing
- Quality of vendor code and tiered development approach
- Tier 3 more complicated than anticipated

Scope Change Orders

- Completeness of requirements
- Managing scope to focus on core functionality


User Acceptance Testing

Go Forward Strategy (cont'd)

Revised Governance / Project Management

- Overall project responsibility in the hands of CEO/IT allows for a more independent perspective and addresses needs of stakeholders
- Enables improved CEO/IT reporting of project to Board of Supervisors
- Divides responsibility across multiple project leads to <u>focus</u> on specific deliverables and support to each department
- Project Leads <u>responsible</u> for and held <u>accountable</u> for their deliverables
- Enables greater communication at the working level on a daily basis
- Issue resolution handled at project team level but managed by Senior PM
- Testing receives necessary focus
- Assigns appropriate subject matter experts to directly support agencies
