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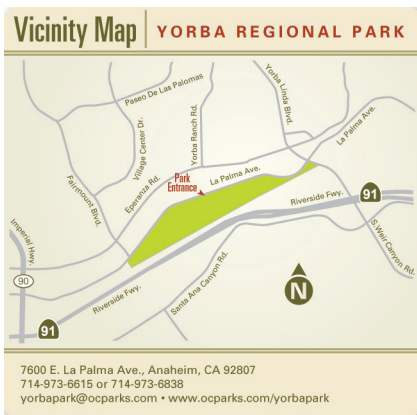

The Santa Ana River Regional Riding and Hiking Trail was recently named a National Recreational Trail. Coinciding with National Trails Day (June 2), a small celebration will take place on Thursday, May 31 beginning at Yorba Regional Park.

The U.S. Secretary of Interior recognized the Santa Ana River Trail as an exemplary local and regional trail as part of America's national system of trails.

Currently, the Santa Ana River Trail is 29 miles and goes through Riverside and Orange counties. The overall vision for the trail will be to span 110 miles, connecting Big Bear Lake to the Pacific Ocean.

Participants are invited to walk, bike or ride their horses on the dynamic trail and witness the unveiling of a special sign designating the Santa Ana River Trail as a National Recreation Trail.
