## Santa Ana River Project/Army Corps of Engineers


- FY 2012 workplan contained an additional \$3 million for SARP for a total of \$23 million, as well as nearly \$2 million for Newport Bay Harbor
- FY 2013 President's budget allocated only \$7.2 million—not enough to keep the project on schedule

## Santa Ana River Project/Army Corps of Engineers

- Corps was not expecting such a low number and does not have large amounts of unexpended funding from previous years
- Congress has limited ability to increase funding—programmatic funding increases are permissible but individual project increases are not

 Subcommittee chair calls Corps budget
 "grossly underfunded"



#### **Pension Reform**

- Treasury Department meeting on March 6, a disappointment
  - Officials not closer to a ruling
  - Opposition from national labor unions



#### **Pension Reform**



- Sanchez bill (HR 2934)
  - CBO scoring requested
  - Ways & Means Committee staff request meeting with Sanchez & Calvert staffs
  - Congresswoman Sanchez hoping to brief
     Senator Feinstein on the issue

### Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (PPACA) before the Supreme Court

- Three days of oral argument beginning March 26, for four major issues
  - Applicability of the Anti-Injunction Act of 1867
  - Constitutionality of the individual mandate requirement
  - Severability of the individual mandate from the rest of ACA; and, constitutionality of Medicaid expansion

### Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (PPACA) before the Supreme Court

- Three scenarios for the future of ACA
  - Court declares act unconstitutional
  - Court finds ACA to be constitutional, but a Republican is elected President and the Senate turns Republican
  - ACA is constitutional and President
     Obama is re-elected

#### **Surface Transportation Reauthorization**

- Senate passes two-year, \$109 billion, bipartisan bill (S. 1813)
- Breakdown in House attempt to pass either five-year bill (H.R. 7) or 18-month bill; may resort to simply taking up S. 1813
