Chamber also commemorate 100 years of serving the Brea business community at annual Gala

Brea, Ca. – Industry leaders, elected officials and area residents joined the Brea Chamber of Commerce on Friday, January 25 to pay tribute to the community's high achievers. Orange County Supervisor Shawn Nelson served as master of ceremonies for the annual Membership & Awards Gala. The awards recognize local companies and individuals for a variety of achievements, including community involvement, creating jobs and advocating for a strong local economy.

In presenting the annual report to members, Chamber CEO Sharon Wagner outlined the organization's accomplishments in 2012. She also stressed the importance of a united business community in empowering each individual business success. "We connect companies to the people, tools and information they need in order to reach their full potential," she said. "Many of our long-time members credit their Chamber membership as the key factor in their success."

The Business of the Year: Manufacturing award was presented to UTC Aerospace Systems, a company that recently relocated to Brea and brought with it a significant number of living wage jobs. Once one of the world's largest and most respected manufacturers of rubber products, they are now a global leader in the aerospace, defense and homeland security markets. The Brea facility produces systems and components that power aircraft, control aircraft engines, and monitor aircraft systems and the external environment. They proactively enhance their local communities through financial and volunteer support, believing their vitality as a business is linked with the quality of life in the communities where they operate.

Mother's Market & Kitchen opened in Brea at the tail end of the Great Recession, bringing valuable jobs to our community at a very critical time. While most retailers were focusing solely on keeping their doors open, this business focused on becoming the very definition of good neighbor.
