The District Attorney is Legally Bound to Investigate and Prosecute Cases

 The DA is the public prosecutor, vested with power to conduct all prosecutions for public offenses (Gov. Code section 26500)


 Investigation and gathering of evidence relating to criminal offenses is responsibility which is inseparable from the district attorney's prosecutorial function.

OCDA Local DNA Database Program

OCDA COLLECTION OF DNA SAMPLES

- Collected by the OCDA office as a result of a negotiated disposition of the individual's criminal case for the OCDA DNA database
- DNA collection stations exist at each courthouse


All persons who provide DNA samples do so voluntarily

The Difference Between Casework and Database Testing Laboratories

Casework Laboratory (OCCL)

- Analyzes crime scene evidence collected by CSI personnel
- Analyzes evidence reference samples for comparison to crime scene samples
- Must successfully complete casework FBI audits in addition to maintaining external accreditation

Databasing Laboratory


- Analyzes samples from offenders and individuals for inclusion in law enforcement DNA databases
- Must successfully complete database FBI audits in addition to maintaining external accreditation

Requirements for Casework Laboratories, such as OCCL, to Process both Casework and Database Samples

- Separate labs prevent cross-contamination because the offender samples are processed in a separate location
- DNA contamination occurs when DNA is introduced unintentionally into a sample
 - The threat of cross-contamination between the crime scene evidence and offender samples submitted for database processing is prevented
 - The legal challenge that the DNA from offender samples has been cross-contaminated with crime scene evidence tested in a criminal case is prevented



 Provides investigative leads to law enforcement



 OCDA has provided 60,975 individuals profiles to CODIS that would not have been obtained without the OCDA DNA Database program
