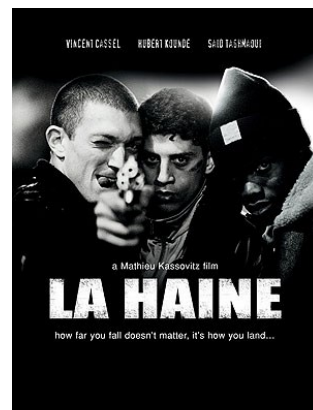
“Dismantling Archetypes: Breaking down barriers through film.”
