ORANGE COUNTY VETERANS SERVICE OFFICE

Program Overview:

The Orange County Veterans Service Office (OCVSO) actively pursues the rights of veterans and dependents of the United States Armed Forces to receive Department of Veterans Affairs benefits. The Veterans Service Office reports to the California Department of Veterans Affairs (CDVA) and is a member of the California Veterans Service Officer Association, which advises CDVA on developments and issues facing the California VSOs collectively. Orange County is considered by CDVA as a large veteran's population county, raking 4th in veterans population in the state of California with approximately 130,000 veterans from any era residing in the county.

The OCVSO works in partnership with OC4VETS, which is a behavioral health program catering to veterans who may need behavioral health screenings, case management, housing and employment. The Orange County VSO also collaborates with the Orange County Veterans Advisory Council. The function and duties of this Council are: to provide a source of liaison and communication with various groups relative to veteran's issues and promote involvement in veteran's related events and functions within the county.

Additionally, the OCVSO offers expert advice and counsel to help veterans navigate the often complex process of submitting entitlement packages to the Veterans Benefits Administration, Veterans Health Administration and the Cemetery Administration.
