# Dispute Resolution Program Act (DRPA)

# Funding Source: Civil Filing Fees (Agenda Item # 53)

#### **Target Population**

Residents and businesses seeking alternative dispute resolution services, primarily mediation and conciliation.

#### **Program Description**

The purpose of the DRPA is to provide resolution services (formal and informal) which are designed to assist parties in resolving disputes without the necessity of formal judicial proceedings.

#### Referrals for Services

- Most referrals come from the Justice Centers throughout Orange County, including Small Claims, Limited Civil, Landlord Tenant and other types of cases.
- •Mediation referrals may also originate from other County and City Agencies, such as Police and Probation and other community agencies.

#### What is a One-Stop and Business Service Center?

- A single location for the public and business community to access services.
- Job seekers find jobs, Businesses find employees.

The Center system is designed to help individuals find employment. Services include vocational training, assessments, job search skills workshops, and career development. Business services include: rapid response to worker lay-offs / plant closures, lay-off aversion, applicant screening and incumbent worker training.
