PROJECT UPDATE

As SDG&E relocations near completion, construction to widen road has resumed

After a delay of several months, SDG&E has made significant progress recently in relocating its facilities. The status update for the SDG&E relocations is as follows:

- South side of Crown Valley Parkway west of Marguerite substantially complete
- North side of Crown Valley Parkway west of Marguerite complete with the exception of one street light near Dr. Guavara Way.
- Crown Valley Parkway east of Marguerite completion scheduled for the end of October

On September 12, the City's contractor, All American Asphalt, resumed work on the widening improvements to Crown Valley Parkway. Today they will begin pouring for the new curb and gutter on the south side of Crown Valley Parkway. The traffic signal subcontractor resumed work on September 14 and is making preparations for the placement of new traffic signal poles.

The updated schedule is as follows:

Eastbound Widening (south side of Crown Valley Parkway)

- September October: pour curb and sidewalk; pave new lane; traffic signal modifications.
- November January: landscaping and lighting

Westbound Widening (north side of Crown Valley Parkway)

- October December: clearing; demolition; grading; walls and structures; storm drains
- January February: pour curb and sidewalk; pave new westbound lane
- March May: landscaping and lighting

Median Improvements

- February March: clearing; demolition; grading; storm drains
- April: pour median curb; stamped concrete
- May June: landscaping and lighting

Every effort will be made to minimize impacts to residents, businesses and motorists throughout this and all phases of construction. Due to unforeseen operational factors or inclement weather, these dates and times may change.
