**ABALONE STEAKS:** Drive down the South Day Use Area and look across Pacific Coast Hwy. The

<u>CRITTER OF THE MONTH:</u> Abalone are mollusks having one-piece shells. They once abounded along the southern California coast, but were over hunted by

humans in the 1950's - 1970's and decimated by Withering Foot Syndrome in the 1980's - 1990's. Long time coastal residents will often have abalone shells around their homes, inside and out, and will tell you of delicious abalone dinners. Visit the following
