DUI Enforcement Operations August/Labor Day Holiday Schedule

SANTA ANA, California (August 16, 2012) – The Orange County 'Avoid the 38' DUI Task Force will be conducting sobriety/driver's license checkpoints and DUI saturation patrols throughout Orange County to stop, test and arrest impaired drivers who fail to use a designated driver. The August/Labor Day Holiday DUI Campaign runs from August 17 to September 3, 2012.

Sobriety/Drivers License Checkpoint:

- City of Anaheim: Saturday, August 25, 6:00 p.m. to 2:00 a.m.
- City of San Juan Capistrano: Friday, August 31, 6:00 p.m. to 2:00 a.m.
- City of Brea: Friday, August 31, 6:00 p.m. to 2:00 a.m.
- Cypress and Placentia will also be conducting Sobriety/Drivers License Checkpoints between August 17 and September 3, 2012. Exact dates are yet to be announced.

DUI Saturation Patrols:

- Orange County Sheriff's Department: Friday, August 17, 7:00 p.m. to 3:00 a.m.
- Placentia Police Department: Saturday, August 25, 8:00 p.m. to 3:00 a.m.
- Garden Grove Police Department: Saturday, August 25, 8:00 p.m. to 3:00 a.m.
