## **JUVENILE JUSTICE CRIME PREVENTION ACT 2007-2008 PROGRESS REPORT**

On January 11, 2001, Orange County's Comprehensive Multi-Agency Juvenile Justice Plan was approved for funding by the (then) Board of Corrections. The Orange County Probation Department's plan was the first in the state to receive approval for funding under the Schiff-Cardenas Juvenile Justice Crime Prevention Act of 2000.

The Probation Department's 2007-2008 plan supported ten on-going programs aimed at improving juvenile justice and accountability in Orange County.

The 2007-2008 funds available for Orange County's JJCPA programs totaled \$10,108,173. This sum includes \$9,766,326 in allocated funds plus \$341,847 in interest earned. This figure represents an increase of \$218,749 over funding available for FY 2006-07. In past years, expenditures for several of the programs also included additional funding by the Challenge Grant, Juvenile Accountability Block Grant, Office of Emergency Services, Title IV-E, and the County General Fund. Beginning in the 2004-05 fiscal year, however, the additional funding from most of the above-mentioned sources ended or was decreased. In 2007-08, the JJCPA-funded programs received additional funding of \$709,628 from one source, the Title IV-E funding.

Current law requires each county receiving funding pursuant to Section 30061 of the Government Code to report annually by October 15, to the Corrections Standards Authority (CSA) on specified program outcomes and the annual per capita cost of each program. The data submitted to the CSA via on-line reporting templates includes a financial page listing expenditures for each program, participation figures and the required per capita calculation, and the fiscal year Outcome Measures for each program.

The attached pages summarize the data requested for each program by the CSA. A one-page Expenditure Chart summarizes the financial data followed by a two-page summary of the FY 2007-08 Results Highlights. The remainder of the attachment includes detailed fiscal summaries for the ten programs and the FY 2007-08 Outcome Measure results charts for each program. It should be noted that cumulative multi-year results for all JJCPA programs are currently being compiled, and when completed, will provide a more comprehensive summary of each program's overall effectiveness than is available from the one-year CSA-required results.

Together JJCPA programs provided services to 3,350 participants during the 2007-08 fiscal year. As expected, the prevention and early intervention programs (Truancy, SMART, and Decentralized Intake) continue to serve the greatest number of participants with relatively low costs per participant overall. During this year, the Truancy Program continued to increase the numbers served of younger (under age 12) truant youth and their parents. The intervention and secure confinement programs serve the high-risk juvenile offenders that are already in the formal justice system. These programs provide intensive, collaborative services in a community, day-treatment center (Youth and Family Resource Centers), in a court-ordered treatment program (Juvenile Drug Court) or custody environment (STEP, ASERT, Older Boys Program). For every juvenile served at the Youth and Family Resource Centers, which have the highest costs per participant, it is estimated that a total of three individuals actually receive services -- the juvenile offender and two other family members.

Since its implementation in 2001, JJCPA-funded programs have served more than 17,000 at-risk youth and juvenile offenders in the county. The early findings from the 2001-2008 cumulative evaluation suggests that all six of the programs measuring school attendance and academics have seen positive gains for participants by their program exit. Of the nine programs expecting lower new law violation arrest rates for program youth versus comparison youth, all have achieved this goal or demonstrated progress toward that goal for important sub-groups of program participants.

The Schiff-Cardenas Juvenile Justice Crime Prevention Act provides Orange County with crucial funds that continue to have a major impact on the County's Continuum of Juvenile Services.

# Orange County Juvenile Justice Crime Prevention Act FISCAL YEAR 2007/2008 RESULTS HIGHLIGHTS

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## JJCPA PROGRAMS TARGETING JUVENILE OFFENDERS

**YOUTH AND FAMILY RESOURCE CENTER – WEST COUNTY (CPA 1):** Continues the successful YFRC models aimed at reducing recidivism and preventing high-risk youth from becoming chronic repeat offenders. (NOTE: JJCPA funding for this program began in FY 04-05.

- Total Youth Served (FY 07-08): 125 juveniles and their families
- Cumulative Program Outcome Highlights:
  - ✓ *During Program:* The proportion of program participants who were at or above grade level more than doubled by their program exit (36% at exit vs. 16% at entry)
  - ✓ *Program Exit:* 100% of the Program Participants had fulfilled their victim restitution obligation by program exit in contrast to only 40% of the Reference Group.

**YOUTH AND FAMILY RESOURCE CENTER – NORTH COUNTY (CPA 2):** Continues the successful North YFRC program and expands eligibility to youth from all cities in the north region of Orange County.

- Total Youth Served (FY 07-08): 129 juveniles and their families
- Cumulative Program Outcome Highlights:
  - ✓ *One-Year Post Entry:* After one year in the program, over half (53%) of the Program Participants had no subsequent arrests for new law violations.
  - ✓ *Program Exit:* Program Participants' completion rates for fulfilling their victim restitution obligation and community service hours were nearly twice that of the Reference Group (73% and 60% respectively in contrast to 40% and 33%).

**ASERT SUBSTANCE ABUSE PROGRAM (CPA 3):** Enhances a federal grant treatment program, which provides intensive drug intervention and education programming for males ages 12-18 with a history of significant substance abuse and adds an important after-care supervision component.

- Total Youth Served (FY 07-08): 206 juveniles
- Cumulative Program Outcome Highlights:
  - ✓ *Program Exit:* Program Participants had higher probation completion rates by program exit compared to the Reference Group (45% vs. 35%).
  - ✓ *One-year Post Program:* One year after program exit, seven out of ten Program Participants had no new law violations.

**JUVENILE DRUG COURT (CPA 4):** Expands this highly successful program aimed at breaking the escalating patterns of drug and alcohol use among this at-risk population.

- Total Youth Served (FY 07-08): 58 juveniles
- Cumulative Program Outcome Highlights:
  - ✓ *During Program:* Program Participants had a lower rate of positive drug tests when compared to the Reference Group (9% positive vs. 14%).
  - ✓ *One Year Post Entry:* Program Participants had a lower re-arrest rate for new law violations compared with the Reference Group (38% vs. 60%).

**OLDER BOYS PROGRAM (CPA 5):** Provides transitional and vocational program services within a non-secure institutional setting for 18-year-old boys serving a juvenile court-ordered commitment.

- Total Youth Served (FY 07-08): 188 boys
- Program Outcome Highlights:
  - ✓ *Six Months Post-Program:* Program Participants were more likely to have completed probation by six months after program exit than the Reference Group (34% vs. 25%).
  - ✓ *Six Months Post Program:* Program Participants had a lower re-arrest rate for new law violations than the Reference Group (33% vs. 44%).

**SUBSTANCE ABUSE TREATMENT BEDS (CPA 10): Supports a multi-disciplinary assessment process to screen minors for substance abuse problems and provides funds for community residential drug abuse treatment beds.**

*During FY 07/08, this program served one youth. As of July 1, 2008, the program has been terminated.*

**STEP SOBRIETY GIRLS PROGRAM (CPA 11): Expands gender services within a non-secure institutional setting for juvenile girls serving a court-ordered commitment.**

- Total Youth Served (FY 07-08): 85 girls
- Program Outcome Highlights:
  - ✓ *During Program:* By program exit, Program Participants' mental health evaluation scores had improved by an average of 22%.
  - ✓ *Six Months Post-Program:* The Program Participants had a lower re-arrest rate for any violations compared with the Reference Group (29% vs. 50%).

### **JJCPA PROGRAMS TARGETING AT-RISK POPULATIONS**

**DECENTRALIZED INTAKE (CPA 7): Program provides immediate counseling and diversion services for youth in unincorporated areas and cities served by the Sheriff, and expedited handling of cases referred to Probation.**

- Total Youth Referred (FY 07-08): 1,575 juveniles referred to PRYDE Diversion or Probation
- Program Outcome Highlights:
  - ✓ One year after referral, DCI participants had a lower re-arrest rate than the Reference Group (18% vs. 24%) and 83% of participants had no new law violation arrests.
  - ✓ DCI has reduced the time a DCI juvenile spends in the county justice system by 166 days, from an average of 272 days pre-implementation to the current average of 106 days.

**TRUANCY RESPONSE PROGRAM [TRP] (CPA 8): Program goal is to reduce truancies by targeting chronic truants who have not responded to traditional approaches. Participating school districts report an overall decline in truancy rates.**

- Total Youth Referred (FY 07-08): 659 juveniles referred to Probation/DA
- Program Outcome Highlights:
  - ✓ Truant Youth showed a 32% reduction in their average truancy rate in the six months following referral compared with the six months prior to program placement.
  - ✓ Truant youth satisfactorily completing the program had a lower re-arrest rate six months after program exit than truant youth exiting the program unsatisfactorily (9% vs. 26%).

**SCHOOL MOBILE ASSESSMENT AND RESOURCE TEAM [SMART] (CPA 9): This program aims to reduce violence on or near school campuses. Members of the team respond to calls reporting violence or threats of violence and perform threat assessment and threat reduction follow-up. Team includes staff from OCSD.**

- Total Youth Contacted (FY 07-08): 325 juveniles contacted
- Program Outcome Highlights:
  - ✓ The SMART Team responded to 228 service calls in FY 07-08, which is nearly a third higher than the calls responded to in the year *prior* to SMART implementation (158 calls).
  - ✓ The Sheriff's Department submitted 42 gang-related arrest petitions in FY 07-08 compared with 54 gang-related arrest petitions in the year *prior* to SMART implementation.

## CPA 9: School Mobile Resource Team (SMART)

The purpose of this program is to reduce juvenile crimes at or near school campuses. Members of the SMART team respond to calls reporting violence or threats of violence and they perform threat assessments on high-risk juveniles. Youth who have been arrested are referred to appropriate community resources, family counseling and/or Probation services. The team focuses on the unincorporated areas of the county.
