- Recruited via email, laderalife.com, newspapers, random mailings
- Online survey (option to complete via hard copy)
- 364 responses

DETAILED Findings



Speeding

SPEEDING

RESIDENTS CLEARLY FIND SPEEDING TO BE ONE OF THE MOST CONCERNING BEHAVIORS WITHIN THE COMMUNITY



Number one rated traffic issue:

Speed at which vehicles travel on smaller/neighborhood streets

Also appearing among top issues:

Speed at which vehicles travel in school zones (#3) Disregard for traffic rules and regulations (#4) Speed at which vehicles travel on main streets (#5)

Speeding

Additionally, ratings of traffic controls/solutions again point to concerns about speeding



Traffic control that the <u>greatest</u> number of residents feel we need more of:

Law enforcement for speeding (60% want to see more)

Appearing among top solutions: Additional traffic law enforcement (#2 desired solution)


Speeding also #1 concern mentioned in open-ends asking for further solutions

SPEEDING CONCERNS – STREET BY STREET


RESIDENTS ARE MOST CONCERNED ABOUT SPEEDING ON 4 KEY MAIN STREETS.

PEDESTRIAN & CHILD SAFETY/SCHOOL ZONES

CONCERN FOR THE SAFETY OF PEDESTRIANS AND CHILDREN WAS EVIDENT



Concern in traffic issues ratings:

Pedestrian safety in the roundabouts (#10) Child and pedestrian safety in school zones (#11)

Highly-charged topic... most frequently mentioned topic in "open forum" qualitative comments, especially in reference to speeding in school areas

PEDESTRIAN & CHILD SAFETY/SCHOOL ZONES

IN RESPONSE TO THEIR CONCERNS, RESIDENTS ARE SEEKING SAFETY MEASURES FOR PEDESTRIANS/ CHILDREN AND IN SCHOOL ZONES

Residents want to see more:

Law enforcement in school zones (49%) Crossing guards (29%) Pedestrian crosswalks (28%) Pedestrian bridges (28%)



PEDESTRIAN & CHILD SAFETY/SCHOOL ZONES

Most of the top-ten most highly rated solutions spoke to pedestrian safety

Highly-rated solutions:

Lighted crosswalks (#1) Additional traffic law enforcement (#2) Additional pedestrian paths (#5) Additional crosswalks (#6) Additional crossing guards (#8) Additional pedestrian bridges (#9)

PARKING

RESIDENTS EXPRESS FRUSTRATION WITH PERCEIVED DISREGARD FOR PARKING RULES & REGULATIONS...

Traffic issues:

Disregard for parking rules and regulations (#6)

...AND WITH THE SCARCITY OF PARKING IN NEIGHBORHOODS, AND AT SPECIAL EVENTS



Desired traffic controls:

Parking within neighborhoods (59% want more) Parking at special events (56% want more) Law enforcement for parking (51% want more)

Additional traffic law enforcement (#2) Additional parking within neighborhoods (#3) Additional parking at special events (#4)

However, residents are pleased with the amount of parking available for shopping centers and restaurants

#1 Highest rated as "just about right" – amount of parking for shopping centers and restaurants (79%)

RESIDENTS ALSO HAVE STRONG — AND MIXED — OPINIONS ABOUT ROUNDABOUTS

Rated as a major traffic issue:
Failure to yield right of way in the roundabouts (#2)

Other related concerns:

Speed at which vehicles travel in the roundabouts (#8) Pedestrian safety in the roundabouts (#10)



Roundabouts

RESIDENTS ALSO HAVE STRONG – AND MIXED – OPINIONS ABOUT ROUNDABOUTS



No desire for additional roundabouts:

While 18% feel there are too few roundabouts in the community, 16% feel there are already too many
 Additional roundabouts – rated least helpful of all potential solutions

TRAFFIC VOLUME – A CONCERN DURING DAILY RUSH HOURS



Residents reported concerns with traffic volume in Ladera Ranch, during both morning and evening rush hours

Traffic volume on main streets during <u>morning</u> rush hour (#7 concern) Traffic volume on main streets during <u>evening</u> rush hour (#9)

Traffic volume on main streets during <u>weekends</u> was the least concerning to residents of all the issues rated

OTHER SOLUTIONS

OTHER SOLUTIONS WERE ALSO RATED WITHIN THE TOP TEN...



- Child safety and car seat education Rated #7 among potential solutions
- Digital speed feedback signs Rated #10 among potential solutions

NEIGHBORHOOD ELECTRIC VEHICLES (NEV'S)

NEV's

VERY LOW REPORTED OWNERSHIP OF NEV'S AMONG RESIDENTS



○ 4% reported ownership

Therefore, data among owners could not be analyzed

NEV's

No major changes in ownership levels would be expected



Future purchases of NEV's:

Most (71%) have never considered one Most (88%) somewhat or extremely unlikely to purchase

Reasons for lack of interest:

Does not meet personal/family needs (55%) Expense (53%) No place to store a NEV (frequent open-ended response) "Each institution has to do its own work the way each instrument in an orchestra plays only its own part. But there is also a score, the community. And only if each individual instrument contributes to the score is there music."










