SAVE THE DATE FOR 2011 CALIFORNIA COASTAL CLEAN UP DAY!!

California Coastal Cleanup Day-Orange County (CCD) is just around the corner – September 17, 2011 - and Volunteer Services has been planning since early February. CCD is the premier volunteer event focused on the marine environment in the country. In 2010, more than 80,300 volunteers worked together to collect more than 1,100,000 pounds of trash and recyclables from our beaches, lakes, and waterways. CCD has been hailed by the Guinness Book of World Records as the "largest garbage collection" (1993).

Since the program started in 1985, over 1 million Californians have removed more than 15 million pounds of debris from our state's shorelines and coast. This year marks the 27th Anniversary of the Clean Up!

Volunteer Ambassadors Needed for Coastal Cleanup Day

We are looking for volunteers to help us make California Coastal Cleanup Day a fun and exciting event by serving as ambassadors at cleanup sites on September 17. There are several ways to join the fun...

Clean Up Surveyor: Distribute and collect a survey to clean up day participants. The survey, created by the California Coastal Commission, will measure participant's thoughts on the clean up event and help make future events even more successful!

BYO Buddy: Help educate clean up participants on the BYO (Bring Your Own) campaign and create a tally of what BYO items (reusable bags, buckets, water bottles, and gloves) were brought to the event.

Clean up Photographer: Capture the excitement of Coastal Cleanup Day by taking photographs of volunteers and staff during and after the clean up. Photos will be used to thank volunteers for their efforts and in the marketing of future clean ups.

Results Accumulator: During the week of Oct 3 – 7, volunteers are needed to tally the Clean Up Data Cards. Total numbers of smoking-related debris, dumping debris, medical debris, and other debris items are sent to the Coastal Commission for future Clean Up improvements.

Clean Up Data Card Collector: Distribute and collect Data Cards from participants at the event. Data card information include specifics on amount and kinds of debris found at cleanup sites on September 17.

Helping Hands

On April 30th the Church of Jesus Christ-Latter Day Saints hosted their annual Helping Hands volunteer day. This year approximately 600 volunteers participated at several sites within OC Parks!

Fifty of those volunteers assisted at Aliso and Wood Canyons Wilderness Park where they removed non-native plants and replanted an area behind the office with native plants. Adopt-A-Park Volunteer, Ed Hooper, was paramount in making the event successful and fun for himself and all the working volunteers that took part in this event.

Ed's systematic approach and knowledge of native landscapes enabled the volunteers not only to help, but also learn why they were doing what they were doing.
