

Forensic Science Services Division

Crime Lab

- Participated in DNA Stakeholder's Meetings 8 meetings held July 2, 2008 to September 8
 - Meetings included Sheriff, District Attorney, Public Defender, representative from Orange County Chiefs and Sheriffs Association, CEO's office and Bruce Matthias – Director of Legislative Affairs
 - CEO's office is currently preparing a report on their findings
- DNA Advisory Board will be co-chaired by the Sheriff and the District Attorney



Forensic Science Services Division

- Accredited by the American Society of Crime Laboratory Directors/Laboratory Accreditation Board (ASCLD/LAB) since 1992
 - First California Law Enforcement lab to meet and achieve international standard (ISO) accreditation
- Provides scientific lab services to Orange County law enforcement agencies, District Attorney's Office, as well as others under contract – including Santa Monica Police Department, Beverly Hills Police Department, Redondo Beach Police Department, Torrance, LA County District Attorney, Thousand Oaks, Pasadena, El Monte, Manhattan Beach Police Department, Monrovia, Long Beach Police Department
- 70 percent of business comes from outside the Sheriff's Department jurisdiction

Department Internal Review of the Special Grand Jury's Investigation of the Chamberlain Murder at Theo Lacy

- One lieutenant, one sergeant and two investigators are assigned full-time to this investigation.
- To date, approximately 29,000 documents including various case files, homicide reports and transcripts of the Grand Jury testimony have been reviewed by the investigative team.
- Numerous Department employees have separated from the department as a result of our investigative efforts.
- Other employees are on administrative leave pending further investigation.

Financial and Administrative Services Division

- Budget Services 21 Departmental Budgets over \$700 million.
- Financial Services Payroll, Accounts Receivable/Payable, Grant Administration, Jail Cashiering, Supply Detail.
- Administrative Services Purchasing, Real Property Services, Revenue/Audit, Agenda Staff Reports.
- Law Enforcement Contract Services 12 Contract Cities, OCTA, others.

Financial and Administrative Services Key Issues:

- Cost of doing business continues to increase.
- Revenue growth declining.
- Currently, in the third year of using one-time reserves.
- Reserves will be exhausted in FY 09-10 resulting in large funding deficit.



Communications Division

- Emergency Communications Section Coordinates planning and training with local, State, Federal, and volunteer organizations.
- Engineering Services Section Plan, engineer, design, install, and maintain backbone system equipment and public safety dispatch centers.
- Technical Services Section Plan, design, install, and maintain County Department audio and video systems.
- Program Support Section Provides administrative support to the Division.

Communications Division Key Issues:

- Client Service Provide radio communications systems for over 100 public safety agencies in Orange County.
- Rebanding FCC mandated to move 800 MHz system to different bandwidth.
