The Old Orange County Courthouse Hosts  
**HOBOS TO STREET PEOPLE:  
ARTISTS' RESPONSES TO HOMELESSNESS FROM THE NEW DEAL  
TO THE PRESENT**

[SANTA ANA, Calif.] – The Old Orange County Courthouse presents the exhibition “Hobos to Street People: Artists’ Responses to Homelessness from the New Deal to the Present.”

This timely exhibit features the works of 30 artists working over the last 75 years to document the tragedy of homelessness from the Great Depression to the present. Through painting, printmaking, photography, and mixed media, artists offer glimpses of life on the street.

Curator Art Hazelwood says that, “some of the artists in this exhibition personally experienced homelessness and poverty, some worked directly with organizations to combat poverty, but all of them felt that art could be used to focus attention on homelessness. The idea that art can have a function in society by engaging in a struggle for a better world, and that everyone should take an interest in the well-being of less fortunate people are the twin beliefs of the artists in this show.”

During the Great Depression government programs such as the Works Progress Administration funded artists to document what was happening in the country, including the widespread problem of homelessness. Following World War II artists’ shifted their energies elsewhere, but by the late 1970s with the rise of the modern era of mass homelessness many artists again began to focus on the poor as subjects.

Featured are works by New Deal era artists such as Dorothea Lange, Rockwell Kent, and Giacomo Patri, along with contemporary artists such as Sandow Birk, David Bacon, and Christine Hanlon.

According to art critic Marisa Nakasone, “The images in this exhibit are understandably powerful, shocking, and at times, controversial: these works were intended to stir emotion and incite action.”
