Orange Mayor Carolyn Cavecche was named as the taxfighter organization's new President and CEO.

"A large part of my life has been dedicated to protecting taxpayers, and the growth of OCTax has provided the platform that has allowed me to communicate the organization's agenda of advocating for a fair, understandable, cost-effective and business friendly tax policy that is good for the economy," said Royalty. Last night's second annual event was held at the Island Hotel in Newport Beach and hosted approximately 250 guests and more than 40 elected officials.

Radish Awards went to individuals or organizations that have not been friends to the taxpayers. The Royalty Award is for that individual or organization that has established a legacy of service to the taxpayer.
