Muralist's Biography

The artist's name is Ubaldo Villa. Mr. Villa is a relatively young artist living in Los Angeles, having had some of his work exhibited at a small art gallery in Los Angeles. He specializes in "collage art"--putting images together to make a bigger image or to tell a story.

Explanation of the Mural Design

OneLegacy gave the artist a few images related to donation recognition events and people that were either donor family members or recipients. The man in the picture is a recipient and the girl is a donor family member. The palm tree with the balloons is from one of the donor family recognitions ceremonies where donor families sent a symbolic message contained in the balloon to their loved one who donated. The little girl with the bird is also a donor family member and she's releasing doves as part of the donor family remembrance ceremony. The green hand mold is what OneLegacy offers families: a handprint of their loved one's hand as a memento. The hand mold with Chinese writing was chosen to depict the many different backgrounds and cultures that are impacted by organ donation.

Proposed Location of the Mural

The designated wall for the mural is in a non-public access area of the Coroner Facility. It is a curved wall and the pictures below demonstrate what it will look like. The bottom picture is the whole mural.
