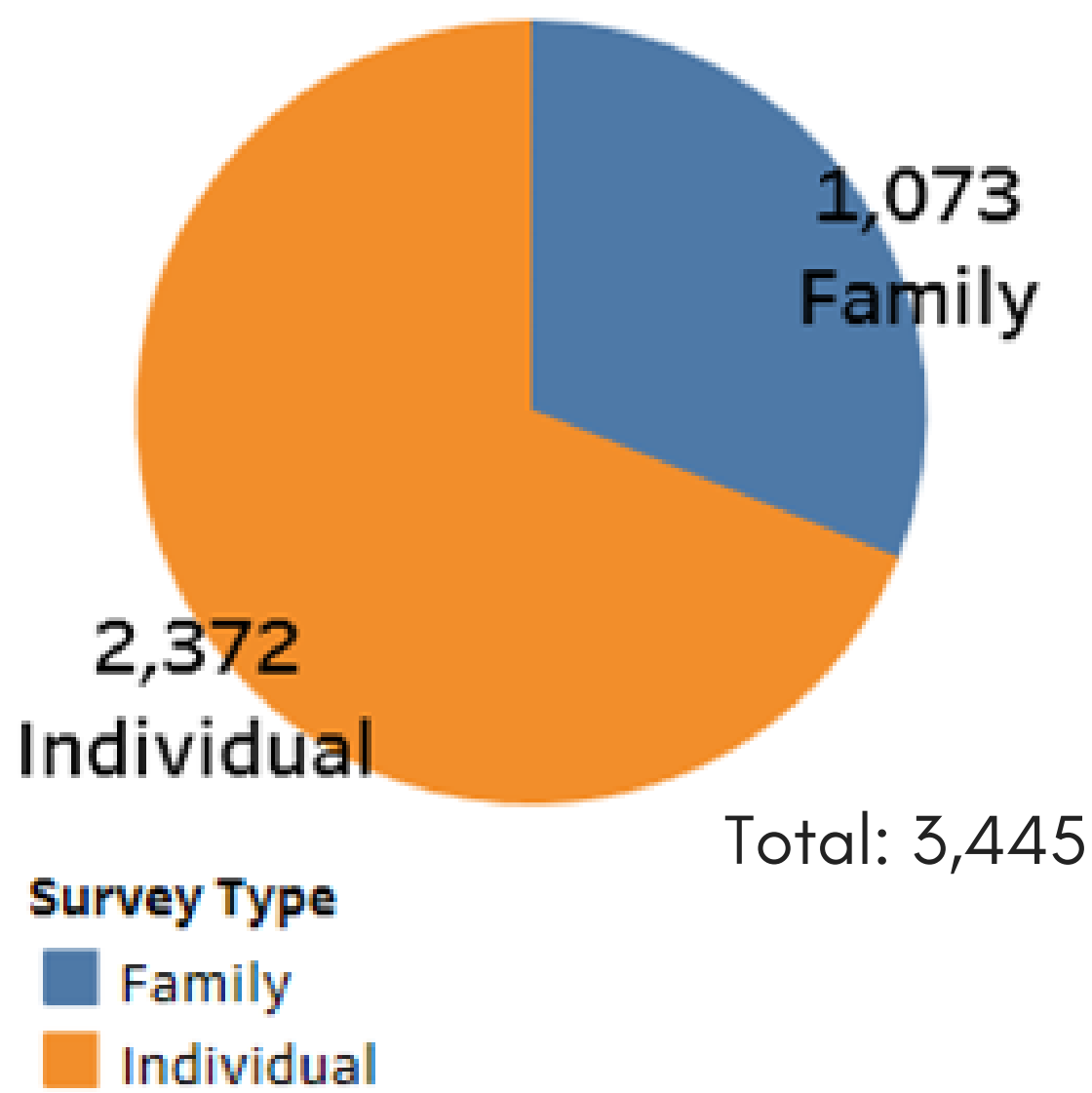

July & August Program Highlights

- Held 2.5 day training for CES Access Points on Vi-SPDAT and CES. Training conducted by Kris Freed of LA Family Housing, in cognition with OrgCode (Vi-SPDAT creator).
 - Training was attended by over 85 people representing 18 agencies.
- Assembled 500 outreach kits that included safety items, poncho, blanket, and bus pass.

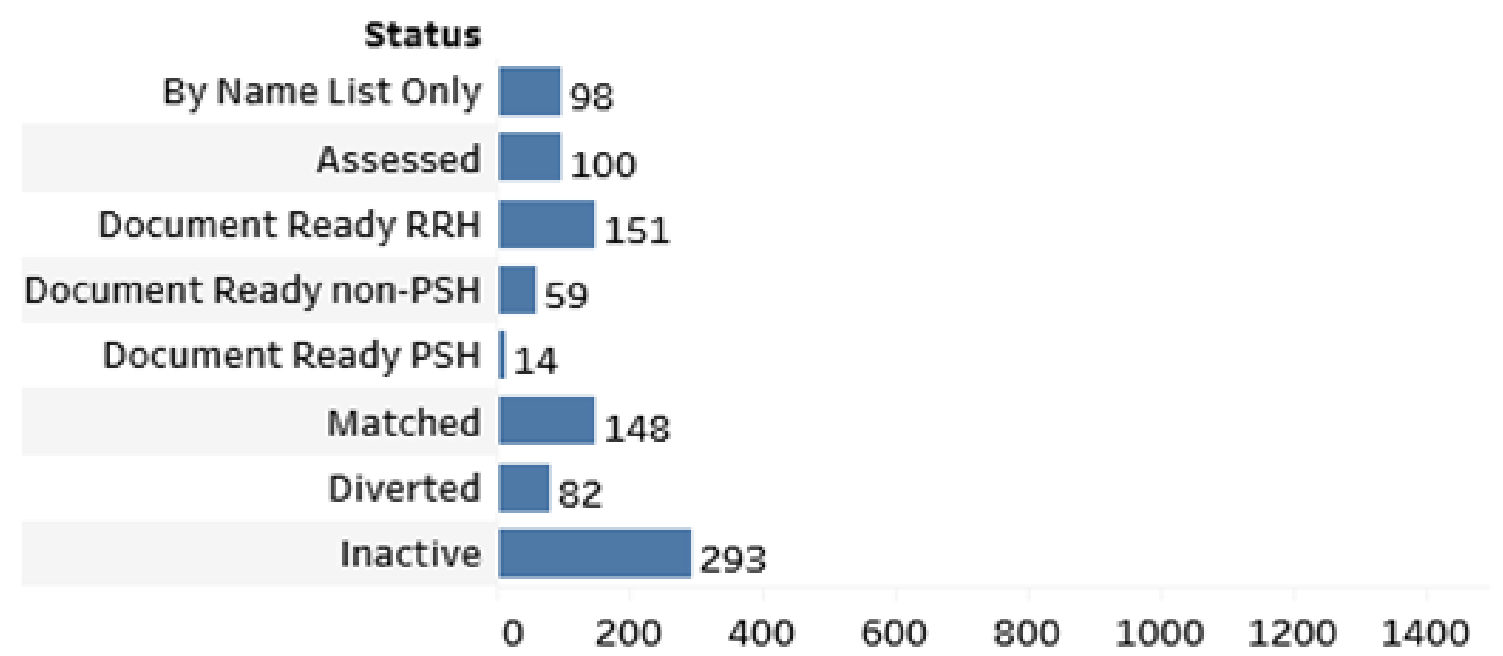

Completed Adult Assessments to Date



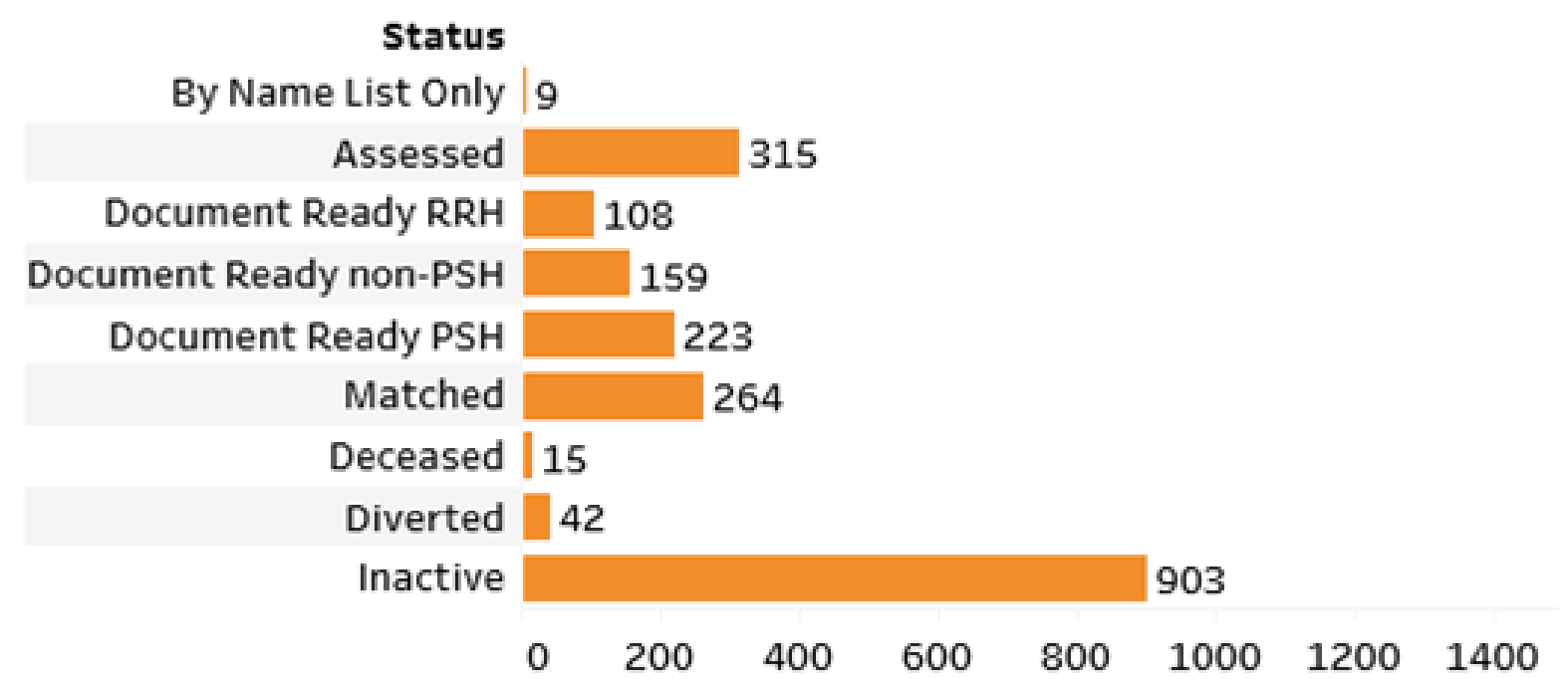

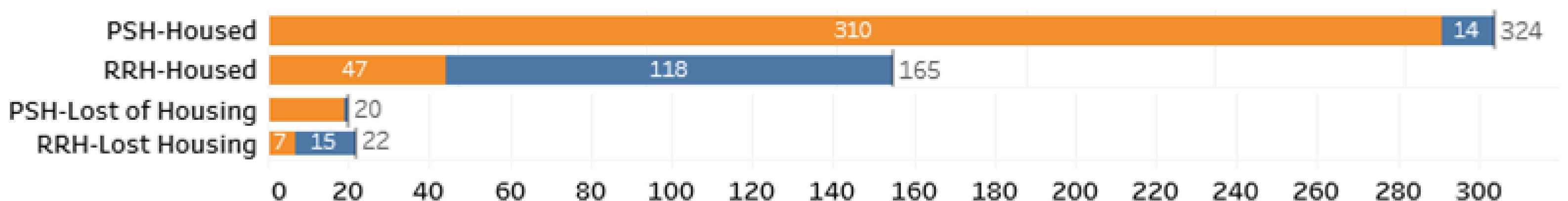
Status of all CES Clients



**"Matched" - This number includes people matched to vouchers and other project based housing opportunities. While the majority of these matches will continue through the process and move to the "Moved in to Housing" category, for various reasons, there will be some who do not complete the housing provider intake process, do not locate a unit to accept their voucher, who do not pass a private landlord's qualifications or who decline the housing.

**Document Ready non-PSH - This category of people score in the PSH range on the Vi-SPDAT, but either do not have the length of homelessness and/or the disability required for chronic homelessness.

Total Clients Housed Through CES

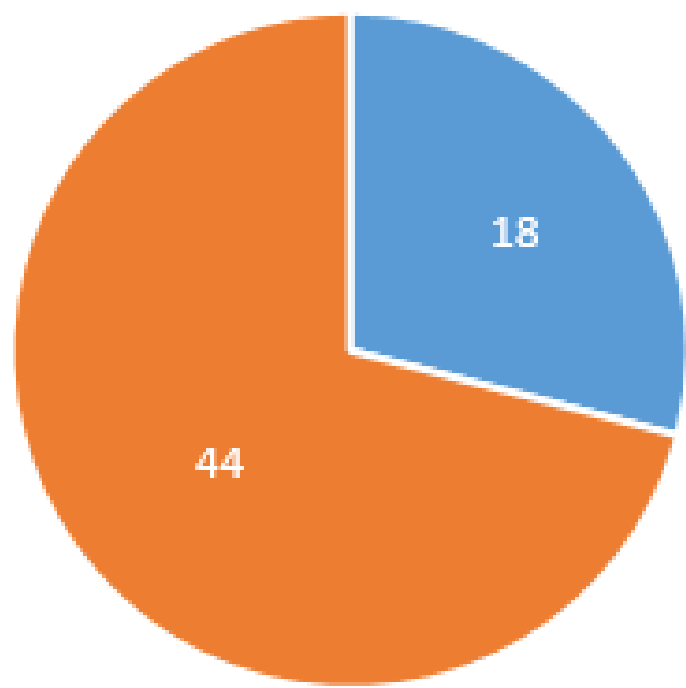


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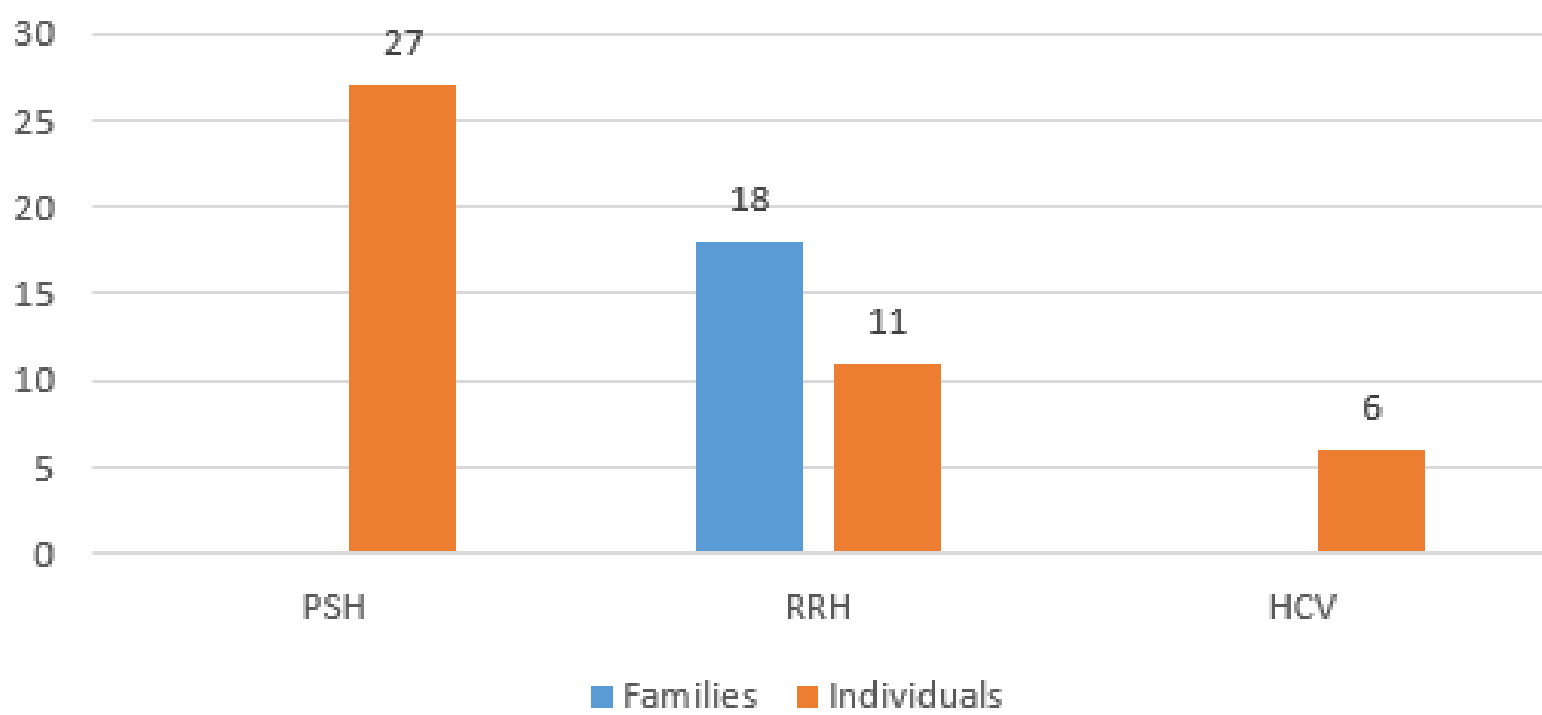
July 2017 Housing Matches

The "Participation in Orange County's Coordinated Entry System Based on HMIS Entries" report shows the percentage of clients that were enrolled in each project and were referred to the project through the Coordinated Entry System.

The report cards are grouped by project type, and only include enrollments with a start date during the reporting period. Clients were determined to be referred from the Coordinated Entry System if the 'Referred from CES' question in HMIS was marked 'Yes.'

All projects receiving ESG and/or CoC funding are required to participate in the Coordinated Entry System.
